# Foreword by Peter Berenyi, a member of the organizing committee European Deaf Chess Championship in Amsterdam 2021

Dutch chess event in Amsterdam is fast approaching and I have been thinking about the reasons why we celebrate TOG's 100th anniversary and the first edition of the Women's World Cup, which took place during the eleventh ICSC Individual Championship in Rotterdam (Netherlands) exactly 25 years ago (1996).

Let's look at the year that ended with the number 1; it's really special!

- The first structured tournament was in Leeds, England in 1841.
- The first international chess tournament was held in London, England in 1851.
- The first international women's sports event was the 1921 Women's Olympiad in Monte Carlo, Monaco. (The first Women's World Chess Championship was in 1927 in London.)
- The first World Junior was held in 1951 in Birmingham, England.

Suddenly there are many reasons to celebrate TOG's jubilee and both TOG and the Dutch OC-Team are looking forward to welcoming you to this European Championship in Amsterdam - Welcome!

However, there is another beautiful location available: the Bijlmer sports center. It is located in the Amsterdam Zuidoost (South-East) district, where the Hostel A&O is also located. # **1. Johan Cruijff ArenA** (Johan Cruijff Boulevard 1)

2. World of Food (Develstein 100)

## Info for those who travel by plane

## For the guests of the hostel A&O:

Arrival at Schiphol airport

## How do you get to the hostel A&O?

Take the train from **Schiphol Airport** station

(platform 3, direction Utrecht Central or Eindhoven Central or Venlo)

to Amsterdam Bijlmer ArenA station.

Traveling by train takes 15 minutes.

A train ticket for a single journey costs € 4.20 per person.

Get off at Amsterdam Bijlmer ArenA (Ajax) station

from there you need to walk to the hostel A&O; this will take 10 minutes.

Hostel A&O - Hogehilweg 22, 1101 CD Amsterdam Zuidoost (Southeast).

## Visit to the Deaf Meeting Center and the center of Amsterdam

After playing chess, you may want to go out. In this case, you should take public transport from the hostel A&O or from the Bijlmer sports center. You don't have to buy a multi-day ticket: if you don't go out every day, you buy 2 x a 1-hour ticket for the round trip. A GVB 1-hour ticket for a single trip costs € 3.20.

#### For those who chose to stay at another hotel:

Arrival at Schiphol airport

#### How do you get to your hostel?

Take the train from **Schiphol Airport** station to Amsterdam.

You should find out yourself which train to chose.

The price of the ticket therefore also depends on your destination.

#### Registration at the hostel A&O

The registration is on Sunday, October 17th, at the hostel A&O from 12:00 PM to 06:00 PM. That's where officials may sign up for their chess players.

If you stay in another hotel, you will go there by public transport.

## The prices of the multi-day tickets

You buy a GVB multi-day ticket (5, 6 or 7 days) from **GVB Service & Tickets**, which can be found everywhere in Amsterdam. See https://reisinfo.gvb.nl/

You need this card to travel by public transport (metro, tram and bus) to the Blijmer Sports Center for chess, to the Deaf Meeting Center for social activities and to the center of Amsterdam for signtseeing.

Here are the rates of the multi-day ticket per person:

5 days (120 hours) € 29,50

6 days (144 hours) € 34,00

7 days (168 hours) € 37,00

## How do you get to the Bijlmer Sports Center playing location?

The address is Anton de Komplein 157, 1102 DR Amsterdam Zuidoost.

## For the guests of the hostel A&O:

The walking distance from A&O hostel to sports center is 1.5 km. That's a 20 minutes walk.

## For the people who have chosen another hotel:

You may probably want to use public transport (metro, tram or bus) to travel from your hotel to the Bijlmer Sports Center.

Take metro 54, direction Gein - get off at Bijlmer ArenA station – walk 10 minutes to this sports center. The exact journey depends on where your hotel is.





## Rules for travelling regarding COVID-19

To see which COVID-19 rules you need to follow when travelling to Amsterdam, please check all risks and other important information in the travel advice of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in your own country before you leave.

Those of you who have not been vaccinated: please let us know immediately at tog@swda.nl

Protect yourself from unpleasant surprises while travelling.

Please read the below corona-rules of the Netherlands closely.

The coronavirus regulations currently holding the Netherlands (September 25, 2021):

## Traveling from abroad

- You must wear a face mask at the airport and on the plane.
- Travelers from risky areas **outside** the EU (European Union), who have been vaccinated, no longer need to be guarantined.

## Face masks in public transport

- You must wear a face mask on the train, tram, bus or metro.
- A face mask is no longer necessary at stations and platforms.

#### 1.5-metre distance

It is no longer necessary to keep 1,5 distance, but it remains sensible to do so.

## **Corona Pass is required**

- to enter restaurants and cafes (also on terraces)
- at sport events

## Corona Pass implies that:

- You have had 2x shots of a vaccine
- You have had corona and recovered.
- You have a negative test of up to 24 hours.

You need to upload a Corona Pass in your smartphone **by yourself**. This is possible via CoronaCheck app. No smartphone? You can also print the QR code.

Testing for corona is free at the GGD (= Municipal Health Service). The test location is behind the Bijlmer Sports Center – Anton de Komplein – Amsterdam-Zuidoost. Open: 08:00 AM – 03:00 PM. You can visit the test location without an appointment.

#### Closing time

• Restaurants and cafes close at midnight.

#### Do not forget

- Wash your hands regularly with soap
- Cough and sneeze into the elbow.
- Don't shake hands.
- In case of complaints: have yourself tested at this test location!


